# Letter from the Chairman



PhilaLandmarks has once again had an extraordinary year! We have advanced many of the core objectives of our Strategic Plan, visibly increasing the stewardship of our historic properties, while also programming and interpreting them.

Many years ago, the Board and House Committees determined that we needed an aggressive approach to addressing deferred maintenance. The first goal was to preserve and secure the envelope of each historic property in our portfolio. We started with the roof project at Hill-Physick, which earned us preservation awards, and was designed with the highest quality materials that should last 100 years. We then moved to the Powel House where we replaced the museum roof and repointed the brickwork, restored and painted the windows on the Third Street façade.

In 2024, we completed a new cedar shake roof at Historic Waynesborough. Our team, comprised of architect Daniel Campbell and Kurtz Construction, did an extraordinary job, restoring the proper appearance to this house. The new shakes and copper elements are simply beautiful! This roof culminates what have been systematic upgrades and restoration projects at Historic Waynesborough.

To complete our major envelope projects, we have been working diligently for a few years to address all exterior issues at Grumblethorpe and its companion Tenant House. We are on the cusp of securing the significant funding to replace these roofs, and also repoint the stone and restore all exterior millwork. This project at Grumblethorpe is critically important. While we plan for this major project, we have continued capital project work at all our properties. In fact, we are nearing completion of a significant window and shutter restoration project at Powel House and we are planning for a full window restoration at Hill-Physick House.

In the foreseeable future, and following the guide of our Strategic Plan, we will soon transition our focus to systems upgrades and interior enhancements. These ongoing improvements will position our properties to best support ongoing programs and interpretations. We want to be a place of physical history telling of our nation's most important stories, while providing venues to our community so that these buildings remain alive as integral community assets.

As always, I want to thank all members for their support, and in particular our Board of Trustees for their gifts of time and financial support. Nothing we do would be possible without our highly professional staff, under the direction of Executive Director Kayla Anthony.

## *Letter from the Executive Director*

### Executive Director Letter

It is with great pride and gratitude that I present our 2023 Annual Report. PhilaLandmarks took great strides forward this year, both internally and externally, with significant accomplishments at all four of its historic house museums.

The year kicked off with a strategic planning session led by our Board Chair, Gregory Montanaro, and PhilaLandmarks' Executive Committee. Through the strategic planning process, we enhanced our previous mission, created new core values that better represent our organization today and, for the first time in our history, created a vision statement. We also outlined organizational goals, benchmarks for achieving our mission, and strategies for the next five years. Finally, we updated our internal collections policies, and our emergency response plans for each of our sites – refreshing and securing our procedures to reflect current museum standards and practices. This was an exciting planning process which will provide our organization with a solid road map for the coming years.

Amongst our external facing achievements, we launched a brand-new website with the expertise and guidance of Board member Elizabeth Streitz Powel. This new and improved website is beautiful, functional, and creates a much fuller picture of our house histories for viewers. Users can easily navigate around the site to experience our history and learn how to book a rental event, support PhilaLandmarks, or participate in our programs and fundraising events.

All four of our House Committees hosted successful fundraisers and new events in 2023. For example, the newly branded “Haunting of Hill-Physick House” fundraiser welcomed a younger audience to the Hill-Physick House and centered on a spooky Halloween theme. Preservation and maintenance projects continued to be a strong focus as we tackled building, security, and garden improvements across all four properties.

Another notable moment of 2023 was our first ever Rum Punch and Revolution fundraiser at Historic Waynesborough which raised money for the house's roof restoration project. While raising funds was the goal of the event, we also met many new faces at this fundraiser and created new relationships with future supporters. Building on this momentum, we secured the remaining funding for the project through competitive grants from the National Park Service, the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, and the Pennsylvania Society of Sons of the Revolution. The fundraising for the \$401,675 project was completed in less than a year's time – a massive accomplishment for the Waynesborough House Committee and PhilaLandmarks Board and Staff. The Historic Waynesborough Roof Restoration project has not only secured the building from material decay but has also helped us build a stronger community around Historic Waynesborough through new relationships with community members and neighbors. This, in addition to the new roof, will enhance Waynesborough's visibility, support, and foothold in the Easttown community and prepare us for celebrating America's 250th anniversary coming up in 2026.

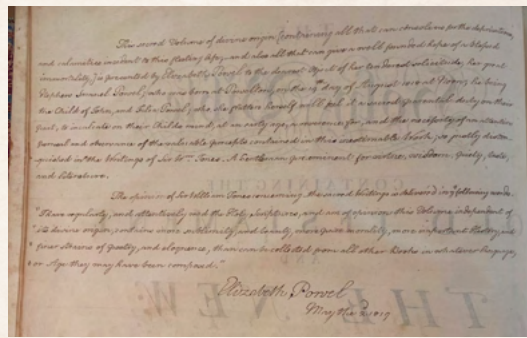
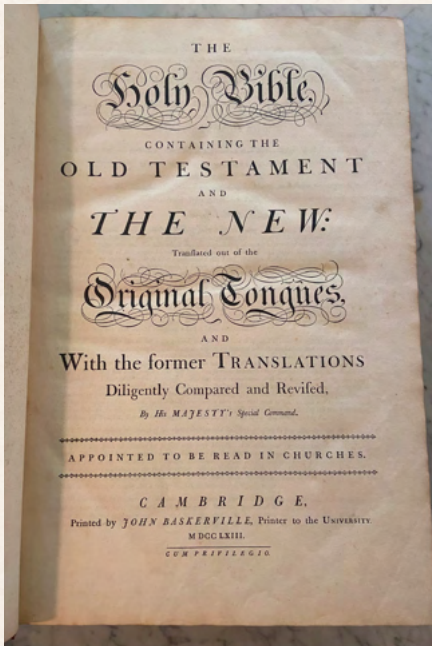

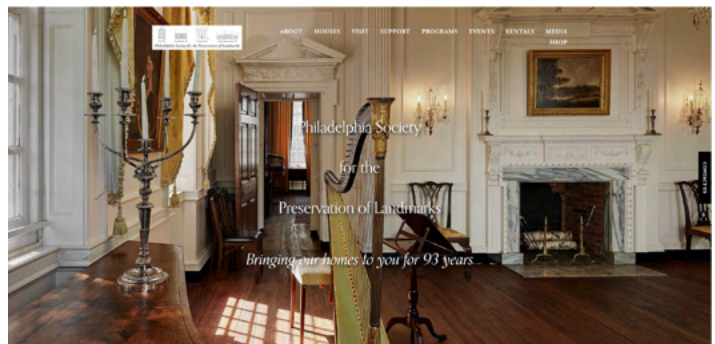




# 2023 ACHIEVEMENTS

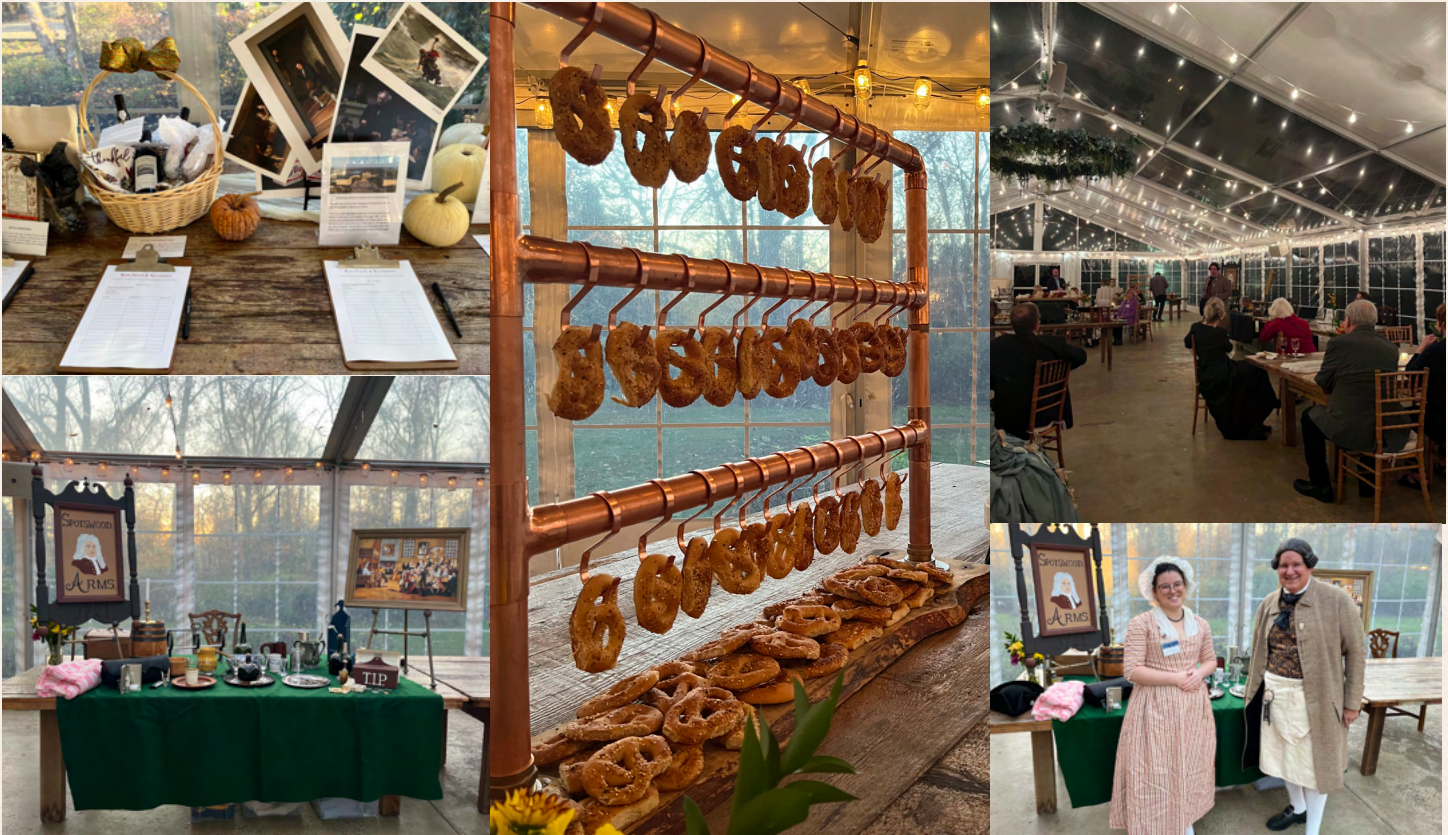
# RUM PUNCH AND REVOLUTION

*A fundraiser benefiting the Historic Waynesborough Restoration Project*

**H**istoric Waynesborough, a Georgian-style country house, was home to Major General Anthony Wayne, Revolutionary War hero, who served with George Washington and the Marquis de Lafayette, leading the Pennsylvania line in the battles of Brandywine and Germantown along with his major victory at Stony Point on the Hudson River.

Historic Waynesborough needed a new roof and PhilaLandmarks, together with the Board of Trustees and Waynesborough House Committee, moved

forward with acquiring the funding for the Roof Restoration Project. This project included replacing the existing cedar shake roof which had reached the end of its serviceable life, added structural stabilization of the porch roof and main block roof, repointing the chimneys at the roof line, and restoration of the dormer windows. PhilaLandmarks secured sizable grant support for the project including the Save America's Treasures grant from the National Park Service (Dept. of the Interior) and the Keystone Historic Preservation Construction Grant from the Pennsylvania Historical



and Museum Commission. In addition, the project received support from generous private donors including the Pennsylvania Society of Sons of the Revolution and many local businesses and community members.

The fundraising campaign was spearheaded by an onsite cocktail party, “Rum Punch and Revolution” on November 3, 2022. The indoor/outdoor tent at Waynesborough was transformed into an 18th century tavern with some guests in historical costume. Jeffrey

Miller Catering sponsored the food for the evening, with Five Saints Distillery, the rum sponsor serving Wayne’s drink of choice – rum. This was an opportunity for the community to come together to support this important preservation project. A variety of activities were offered throughout the evening including a silent auction and presentations by John Smith, a PA archivist, and Dennis Loba, a Virginia historian.

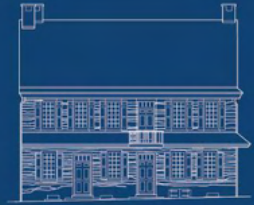
